### Report of the trustees for the year ending 31 December 2016

The trustees of Anonymous Child ("AC"), a Charitable Incorporated Organisation ("CIO"), present their annual report and unaudited accounts for the year ended 31 December 2016 and confirm that they comply with the requirements of the Charities Act 2011 and AC's governing document.

#### **AIMS & OBJECTIVES**

AC aims to fights the cycle of poverty and inequality by providing support to projects that enable the most vulnerable group of society — children and young adults — to become a positive driving force within their communities. We envision a world where all children and young people, regardless of their economic background, are given access to high-quality education and care to ensure a fair start in life and set them on the path towards a brighter future.

Our object is the relief of those in need because of youth, age, ill-health, disability, financial hardship or other disadvantage by providing scholarships to pay for tuition fees and other school related expenses. In our founding year, our launch is focused on the Philippines and we have been active in achieving our objectives. In setting our objectives and planning our activities our trustees have given careful consideration to the Charity Commission's public benefit guidance.

### **REVIEW OF ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS**

In 2016, we identified and partnered with two grassroots organisations in the Philippines. Both organisations provide educational assistance to disadvantaged children and young adults and complied with the scope of our objects.

## 1. Bahay Tuluyan

AC initiated its 1<sup>st</sup> program in May 2016 with Bahay Tuluyan, a children's rights organisation in Manila, Philippines. AC agreed to sponsor 10 young adults that had difficult upbringings and who were pursuing tertiary education. The students have all previously benefitted from a Bahay program and many give back to the organisation by contributing to or leading volunteer programs for the younger children. Many of the sponsored students balance their studies with working to support their families – our assistance helps them to focus on their studies, leading to better educational outcomes. In November 2016, one of the trustees visited Bahay Tuluyan's offices/ facilities, managers and students.

### 2. Children Shelter of Cebu (CSC)

Shortly after launching the program with Bahay Tuluyan, AC started working with CSC, an organisation that has provided a home for orphaned and abandoned children in Cebu since 1979. In response to the needs and challenges of the children it serves, CSC also opened a school – the Cebu Children of Hope School in 1997. AC intend to fund the improvement of its pre-school activities. The funds are used to modernise school materials and classroom utilities.

### **FUTURE PLANS**

With the consent of the Charity Commission on 26 June 2017, the trustees have amended the charity's objects so to remove the geographic restriction on our work. We are currently developing, and aim to implement within the financial year 2017, our first primary project providing pre-school classes in Peru.

# **FINANCIAL REVIEW**

The trustees have agreed to prepare cash-based receipts and payments accounts in accordance with Section 133 of the Charities Act 2011.

### INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES/MEMBERS OF ANONYMOUS CHILD [TO BE ORGANISED]

### RESPECTIVE RESPONSIBILITIES OF TRUSTEES AND EXAMINER [TO BE ORGANISED]
